

Per WDNR Administrative Ruling NR 107(3):

Whenever a proposed chemical treatment exceeds 10 acres (cumulative) or exceeds 10% of the water body that is 10 feet or less in depth, the chemical permit application must include (among other requirements of 107(3) evidence that the public has been notified of the intended chemical application via a notice in the newspaper having the greatest circulation in the area affected by the application. The notice must be in a 2" by 4" advertising format and include:

- Size of proposed treatment area
- Approximate date of proposed treatment
- Public may, within 5 days of the notice being published, request that the applicant conduct a public informational meeting on the proposed chemical application.

The following notice format may be used as a template.

Approximately mid-May, *(insert year)*, up to *(insert)* acres of *(insert plant name, i.e. Eurasian watermilfoil)* on *(insert lake name)* Lake will be treated with *(insert chemical trade name)*.

Water use restrictions will be posted at the public boat landing(s) the day of the treatment. Riparian property owners within 150 feet of treatment sites will receive a copy of the WDNR chemical application permit prior to the date of treatment.

Requests for a public information meeting regarding this proposed application of herbicides may be made to *(insert lake organization contact name and phone number)* within five days of this notice being published.
